LTCCP Consultation

Dave Cameron, Jim Flack and the writer have accompanied Cr Buchanan to eight consultation meetings in late March and early April. Five of the meetings were co-organised with the Wairarapa Hill Country advisory Committee. At the rural meetings, discussions focussed on WRECI and Bovine Tb funding, expansion of the Akura Conservation Centre and implementation of the proposed regional possum / predator control programme. There was unanimous support for all initiatives at the hill country meetings.

Meetings were also held in Greytown and Masterton, providing an opportunity for engagement with urban ratepayers. A specific meeting was held with members of Sustainable Wairarapa.

Divisional Staff Workshop

A workshop for all Catchment Management staff was held at Tauherenikau on 13 February. The major task for the day was to focus on five challenges:

Team brainstorming resulted in a number of excellent ideas being reported back. These have been prioritised and small inter department teams are now working on identifying possible solutions.
